





The alien subsidies (1440-87)

= 82% of the records in EIDB

A new type of tax levied first in 1440 in response to:

- The crown's need for more funds in the final stages of the Hundred Years War
- Anxieties about the growing economic influence of foreigners (especially the Italians and Flemish) anxieties greatest in London
- Anxieties about national security in time of possible invasion from France and its allies





Particular account of aliens taxed in Bedfordshire, 1442-3 (TNA, E179//235/18). **Householders paid 16** pence, non-householders 6 pence

Issues to consider with the alien subsidy evidence

- Rising number of exemptions after 1440
- Tax collection after 1440 more haphazard
- Missing returns from many counties
- Varied identification of nationalities –
 some counties have many unidentified
- How to interpret default
 payments: even in 1440 were 46%
 - often labelled as 'moved' to
 explain why they did not pay

Portion of 1440 alien subsidy for Devon showing Exeter householders taxed 16d and showing those who 'moved'



Prosopographical research shows none of them moved




Issues to consider with the alien subsidy evidence

- Rising number of exemptions after 1440
- Tax collection after 1440 more haphazard
- Missing returns from many counties
- Varied identification of nationalities –
 some counties have many unidentified
- How to interpret default payments: even in 1440 were 46% - often labelled as 'moved' to explain why they did not pay
- How to interpret the balance between householders and nonhouseholders



Letters of denization	6317	1380- 1549	Paid for legal status of denizen (4139 in 1540-49)
Oath of fealty	1858	1436-38	Almost all from the Low Countries
Licence to remain	941	1390- 1482	Paid for right to remain in England (521 Irish in 1394)
Letters of protection	450	1331- 1507	Mostly granted to French residents (300 in 1331-1349)
Tudor subsidies	1948	1523-25	Only for ten counties (including Suffolk)
Misc. other	16		Letters of naturalization, petition, licences



Known origins of resident aliens in Suffolk in 1440 (N=264) and in 1330-1550 (N=721)












Map of all aliens in Suffolk, 1330-1550 (can also search on specific range of years, tax, type of document)— can also zoom in or out
